# GERMANY

Every 20 minutes, a new start-up sets up shop in Berlin. It was one of the first cities in Europe to truly take on the 'tech hub' mantle. A low cost of living coupled with strong investment has created the perfect environment for new technology businesses to flourish, meaning the German capital is a centre of opportunity for tech talent.

Not too far behind is the Bavarian city of Munich. Germany's third largest city - with a population comparable to that of Liverpool in the UK - has long been famed for its automotive industry. BMW was founded in Munich more than 100 years ago, and as car manufacturers turn their attention to electric and connected vehicles, hiring tech talent has become a priority.

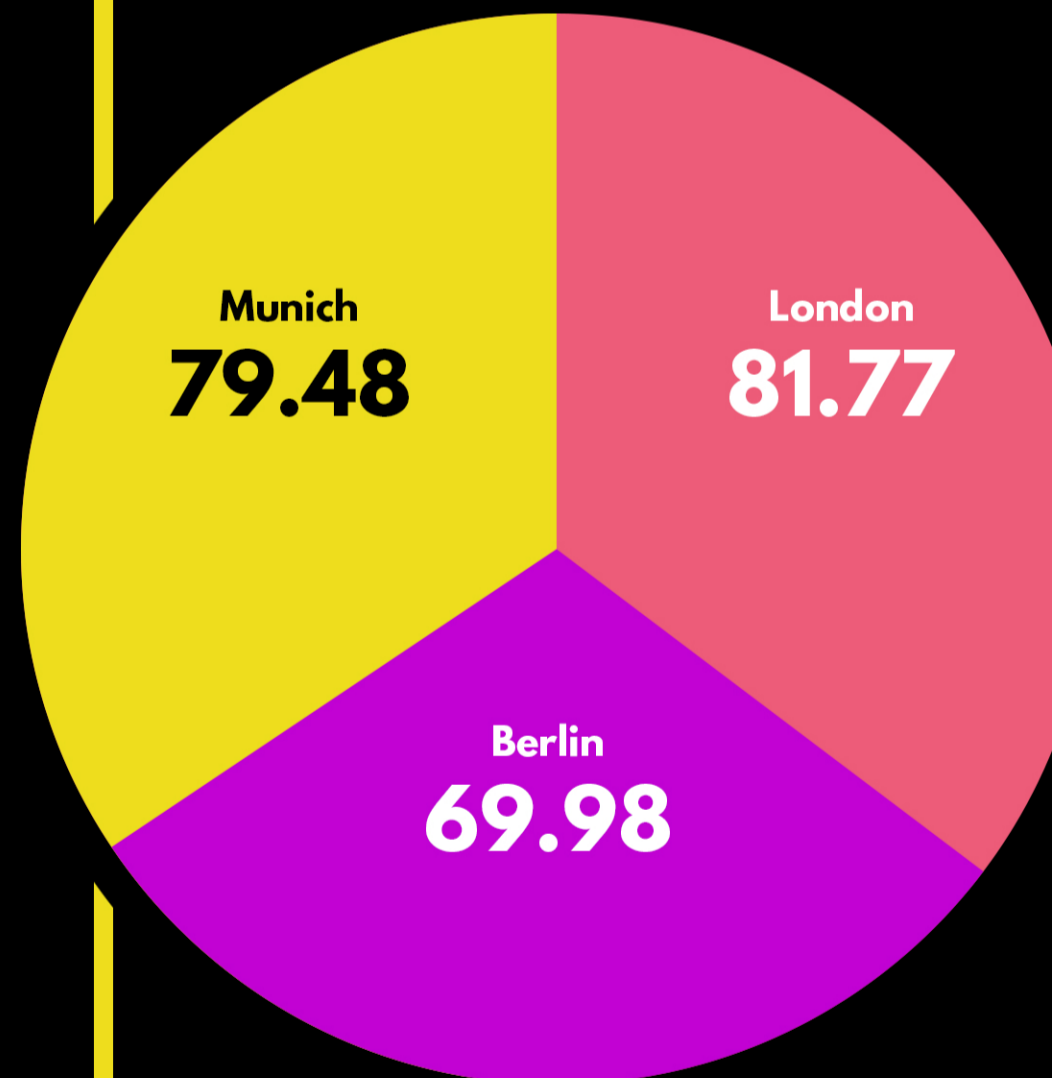
